PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Refresh Your Soul This May

Do you need some extra energy? Do you need enthusiasm to refresh your spiritual life? Then the excitement that comes from celebrating Pentecost is definitely for you. Pentecost may not be as well-known among Christians as Christmas or Easter, but it is a lot more fun. O First of all, Pentecost (this year the date is May 19th) is the "birthday" of the Christian church. And everyone enjoys a good birthday party! Second, this year (again) we will be having an awesome outdoor picnic (at Sunset Lane Park – 2442 Sunset Lane) with fun for the whole family, which will make celebrating Pentecost even more exciting.

You can read about Pentecost in the Bible, in the Book of Acts Chapter 2. It's actually fascinating to learn how the first disciples became filled with the Holy Spirit. Can you imagine being so full of God's Spirit that tongues of fire appear above your head? Also, can you imagine being able to speak every language known on earth?

Regular Christians, like you and me, have been receiving blessings on Pentecost throughout history. If you are still in doubt, then, I encourage you to pray and learn about Pentecost together with me. During the church year, we don't spend enough time talking about the Holy Spirit. Mostly, we are fascinated by the life of Jesus, and, generally, we talk a lot about the Creator God (or God the Father), but it's hard to talk about the force which invisibly sustains us and the whole Universe. Let's be honest. The Holy Spirit is mysterious and difficult to understand. But instead of hiding from the Spirit this May, let's focus our attention on the Third person of the Trinity. On Pentecost, let's remember the importance of that force in the universe, that energy we call the Holy Spirit.

For us, Christians, it's vital to learn more about God's Spirit, because through the Holy Spirit, God works in us and through us in the world. The Holy Spirit inspires us to take the first steps in faith. Then the Spirit encourages and comforts us on our journey, which can be quite difficult sometimes. It is also the Holy Spirit who gives us courage and wisdom to serve God and each other faithfully, when we become "grownups" in the Christian life. Therefore, we need God's Spirit to constantly inspire and enthuse us, so we don't lose hope and don't burn out. Also,

"...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Galatians 5:22-23)

Who doesn't need all these blessings? These qualities are signs that a Christian is being blessed by the Holy Spirit.

Through God's Spirit, we are sent out into the world to change the world, one small corner at a time. Our mission is to spread God's love everywhere. We are sent out to bring peace and justice to all, and to remind all people that God's Spirit is available to comfort, encourage, and enthuse.

So, let me ask you again: do you need some extra energy, joy, and enthusiasm? Then ask God to send you the comforting presence of the Holy Spirit, and the fire in your soul will be rekindled. Come to church regularly, but especially on **Pentecost**; and feel the power of God's Spirit in the midst of your friends, right here at Shiloh UCC.
